Technique used: Crochet



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(75% Microdenier Acrylic, 25% Merino Wool; 3 oz/85 g, 185 yds/170 m ball):

8 (9, 10, 11, 12) oz (A), 8 (9, 10, 11, 12) oz (B), 5 (6, 7, 8, 9) oz (C)

Shown in: #0004 Green Sheen (A); #0012 Foliage (B); #0015 Deep Taupe (C)

One size US J-10 (6mm) crochet hook, or size to obtain gauge. For sizes S, L, and 2X only.

One size US K-10 1/2 (6.5mm), or size to obtain gauge. For sizes M and 1X only.

Stitch markers

One shank button— 1 1/8" (28mm)

Sewing needle and matching thread

Yarn needle



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SIZES

S (M, L, 1X, 2X)

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Bust: 35 1/2" (39, 44, 48, 52 1/4)" / 90 (99, 112, 122, 133) cm

Length: 29 (31, 29, 31, 29)" / 73.5 (78.5, 73.5, 78.5, 73.5) cm

GAUGE

In established pattern, using US J-10 (6.00mm) hook, 3 shells = 5"/12.5 cm and 6 rows = 4"/10 cm.

In established pattern, using US K-10 1/2 (6.50mm) hook, 3 shells = 5 1/2"/14 cm and 6 rows = 4 1/4"/11 cm.

STITCHES USED

Chain (ch), double crochet (dc), half double crochet (hdc), single crochet (sc), slip stitch (slip st).

SPECIAL TERMS

shell: (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in indicated space or stitch.

V-st: (dc, ch 1, dc) in indicated space or stitch.

inc-shell (increase shell): ((dc, ch 1] 3 times, dc) in indicated space or stitch.

NOTES

1. Jacket is worked from the top (yoke) down to the lower edge.
2. Border is added after stitching jacket.
3. Use smaller hook for S, L, and 2X sizes. Use larger hook for M and 1X sizes. Use smaller hook for border on all sizes.
4. When instructed to work a V-st in next shell, work the V-st in the ch-1 space of the shell. Similarly, when instructed to work a shell in next V-st, work the shell in the ch-1 space of the V-st.

YOKE

With A and appropriate hook for desired size, ch 59 (59, 74, 74, 89).

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across, turn—58 (58, 73, 73, 88) sc.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), skip next 2 sts, *shell in next st, skip next 2 sts; repeat from * to last st, dc in last st, turn—18 (18, 23, 23, 28) shells and 1 dc at each end.

Row 3: Ch 3, [V-st in next shell, dc in space before next shell] 2 (2, 4, 4, 6) times, [inc-shell in next shell, dc in space before next shell, V-st in next shell, dc in space before next shell] 2 times, inc-shell in next shell, dc in space before next shell, [V-st in next shell, dc in space before next shell] 4 (4, 5, 5, 6) times, [inc-shell in next shell, dc in space before next shell, V-st in next shell, dc in space before next shell] 2 times, inc-shell in next shell, [dc in space before next shell, V-st in next shell] 2 (2, 4, 4, 6) times, dc in last st, turn—19 (19, 24, 24, 29) dc, 12 (12, 17, 17, 22) V-st, and 6 inc-shells.

Place a marker in the middle ch-1 space of each of the 6 inc-shell. Move markers up as work progresses.

Row 4: Ch 3, shell in each ch-1 space across, turn—30 (30, 35, 35, 40) shells and 1 dc at each end.

Row 5: Ch 3, V-st in next shell, *dc in space before next shell, V-st in next shell; repeat from * across, dc in last st, turn—31 (31, 36, 36, 41) dc and 30 (30, 35, 35, 40) V-st.

Row 6: Ch 3, shell in each V-st across, dc in last st, turn.

Row 7: Ch 3, [V-st in next shell, dc in space before next shell] across to next marker, *inc-shell in marked shell, dc in space before next shell, [V-st in next shell, dc in space before next shell] across to next marker; repeat from * 4 more times, inc-shell in marked shell, dc in space before next shell, [V-st in next shell, dc in space before next shell] across; dc in last st, turn—31 (31, 36, 36, 41) dc, 24 (24, 29, 29, 34) V-st, and 6 inc-shells.

Rows 8–11: Repeat Rows 4–7—43 (43, 48, 48, 53) dc, 36 (36, 41, 41, 46) V-st, and 6 inc-shells.

Row 12–14: Repeat Rows 4–6—54 (54, 59, 59, 64) shells. Fasten off A. Remove markers.

Join B with slip st in first st.

Rows 15–26: With B, repeat Rows 5 and 6 six times (for a total of 12 more rows). Do not fasten off.

BODY

Row 1 (divide for sleeves): Ch 3, [V-st in next shell, dc in space before next shell] 5 (5, 7, 7, 9) times, skip next 17 shells (for first sleeve/underarm), dc in space before next shell, [V-st in next shell, dc in space before next shell] 10 (10, 11, 11, 12) times, skip next 17 shells (for second sleeve/underarm), [dc in space before next shell, V-st in next shell] 5 (5, 7, 7, 9) times, dc in last st, turn—23 (23, 28, 28, 33) dc and 20 (20, 25, 25, 30) V-st. Fasten off B.

Place a marker in the space between the 2 dc at each underarm. Move markers up as work progresses.

Row 2: Join C with slip st in first st, ch 3, [shell in each V-st to next marker, shell in marked space] 2 times, shell in each V-st across, dc in last st, turn—22 (22, 27, 27, 32) shells and 1 dc at each end.

Row 3: Ch 3, *[V-st in next shell, dc in space before next shell] to next marker, (dc, ch 1, dc, ch 1, dc) in marked shell, dc in space before next shell; repeat from * once more, V-st in next shell, [dc in space before next shell, V-st in next shell] across, dc in last st, turn—24 (24, 29, 29, 34) ch-1 spaces.

Row 4: Ch 3, shell in each ch-1 space across, turn—24 (24, 29, 29, 34) shells and 1 dc at each end.

Row 5: Ch 3, V-st in next shell, *dc in space before next shell, V-st in next shell; repeat from * across, dc in last st, turn.

Row 6: Ch 3, shell in each V-st across, dc in last st, turn.

Rows 7–14: Repeat Rows 5 and 6 four times (for a total of 8 more rows).

Remove markers. Fasten off C.

JACKET BORDER

Rnd 1: With RS facing, smaller hook, and working along opposite side of foundation ch (neck edge), join A with sc in first st, sc in each st across neck edge; working over post of st at row ends along front, sc in first 3 rows, [3 dc in next 4 rows, sc in next 2 rows] 6 times, sc in next row, ch 5; working in shells across lower edge, [sc in next shell, ch 5] across; working over post of st at row ends along second front, sc in first 3 rows, [3 dc in next 4 rows, sc in next 2 rows] 6 times, sc in last row; join with slip st in first sc, turn—258 (258, 278, 278, 298) sts, and 25 (25, 30, 30, 35) ch-5 spaces.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, working along front edge, sc in first 3 sts, [hdc in next 3 sts, dc in next 2 sts, 2 dc in next 2 sts, dc in next 2 sts, hdc in next 3 sts, sc in next 2 sts] 6 times, sc in next st; working along lower edge, (2 hdc, 3 dc, 2 hdc) in next ch-5 space and in each ch-5 space across; working along second front edge, sc in first 3 sts, [hdc in next 3 sts, dc in next 2 sts, 2 dc in next 2 sts, dc in next 2 sts, hdc in next 3 sts, sc in next 2 sts] 6 times, sc in next st; working along neck edge, 3 sc in next st, sc in each st across to last st, 3 sc in last st; join with slip st in first sc, turn. Fasten off A.

Rnd 3: Join B with sc in same st as joining, sc in each st across neck edge; working along front edge, sc in first sc, [ch 1, slip st between next 2 sc, ch 1, skip next sc, hdc in next 3 sts, dc in next 3 sts, 2 dc in next 2 sts, dc in next 3 sts, hdc in next 3 sts] 6 times, ch 1, slip st between next 2 sc, ch 1, skip next sc, sc in last sc of front edge; working along lower edge, *hdc in next st, [2 hdc in next st, hdc in next st] 3 times, slip st in sc of Rnd 1 directly below; repeat from * across lower edge; working along second front edge, sc in next st, [ch 1, slip st between next 2 sc, ch 1, skip next sc, hdc in next 3 sts, dc in next 3 sts, 2 dc in next 2 sts, dc in next 3 sts, hdc in next 3 sts] 6 times, ch 1, slip st between next 2 sc, ch 1, skip next sc, sc in last sc of front edge; join with slip st in first sc, do not turn. Fasten off B.

Rnd 4 (RS): Join C with slip st in same st as joining, [slip st in next st, ch 1] across neck edge; *slip st in same space as slip st of Rnd 3, ch 1, [slip st in next st, ch 1] to next slip st of Rnd 3; repeat from * 2 more times, slip st in same space as slip st of Rnd 3, ch 1, [slip st in next st, ch 1] around; join with slip st in same st as joining. Fasten off C.

SLEEVE BORDER

Rnd 1: With RS facing and smaller hook, join C with slip st in base of shell at underarm, ch 3, 2 dc in same space, work 3 dc over post of dc on Row 1 of body, *sc in next shell, 3 dc in space before next shell, 3 dc in next shell, 3 dc in space before next shell; repeat from * to last shell, sc in last shell, 3 dc over post of dc on Row 1 of body; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—9 sc, and 27 3-dc groups.

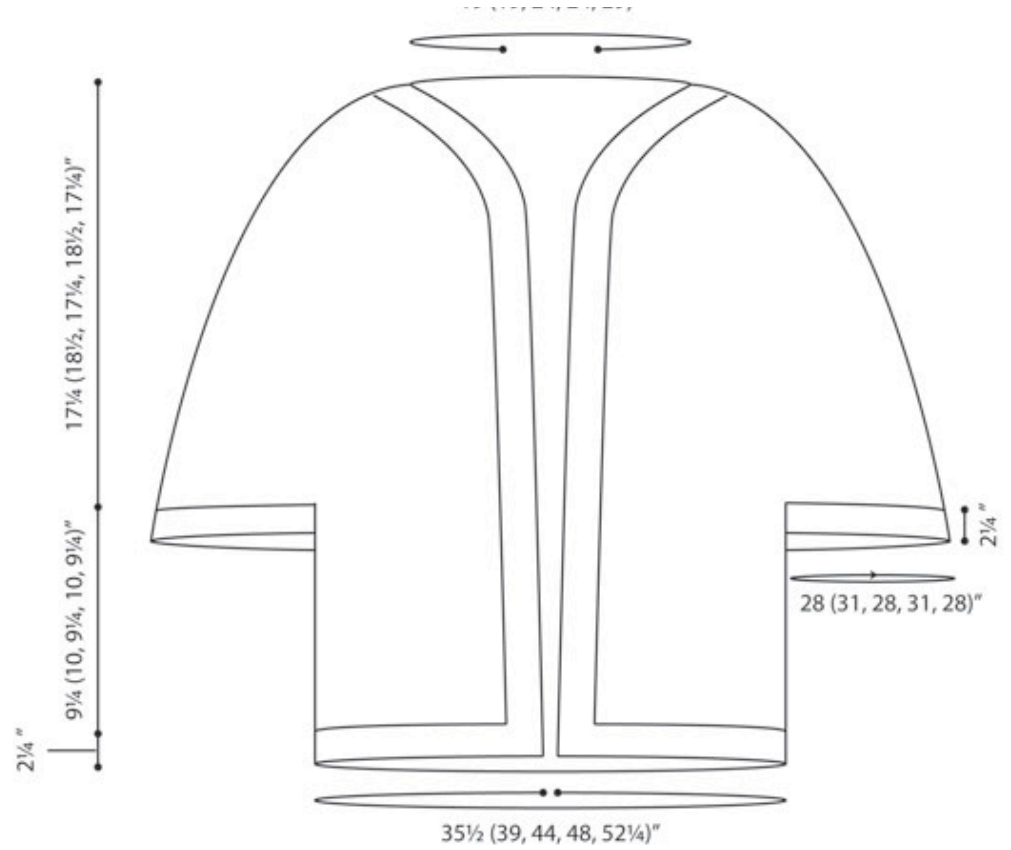
Rnd 2: Ch 3, 3 dc in next st, dc in next st, hdc in next 3 sts, *slip st in next st, hdc in next 3 sts, dc in next st, 3 dc in next st, dc in next st, hdc in next 3 sts; repeat from * 7 more times, slip st in next st, hdc in next 3 sts; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—9 slip sts, 54 hdc, and 45 dc. Fasten off C.

Rnd 3: Join A with slip st in same st as joining, ch 3, dc in same space, 2 dc in next 4 sts, hdc in next 3 sts, *slip st in same space as slip st of previous rnd, hdc in next 3 sts, 2 dc in next 5 sts (fan made), hdc in next 3 sts; repeat from * 7 more times, slip st in same space as slip st of previous rnd, hdc in next 3 sts; join with slip st in top of beginning ch—9 slip sts, 54 hdc, and 90 dc. Fasten off A.

Rnd 4: Join B with slip st in any st, ch 1, [slip st in next st, ch 1] across to next slip st, *slip st in same space as slip st of previous rnds, ch 1, [slip st in next st, ch 1] across to next slip st; repeat from * 8 more times, ch 1, [slip st in next st, ch 1] around; join with slip st in joining. Fasten off B.

FINISHING

With sewing needle and thread, stitch button to left front in center of fan at Row 23.



Note: When garment is worn,
 1. The front corners will rotate and pull down adding extra length and width around lower edge.
 2. The body and sleeves will lengthen and narrow.

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
